RULES

1. All persons competing must enter in one of the Classes hereafter specified, and must reside within a radius of five miles of the Woolavington Post Office.
2. No Professional, Jobbing, or Market Gardener, or Produce Dealer, will be allowed to compete.
3. No Competitor shall employ any *skilled* labour beyond their own, in their gardens or allotments.
4. Intending Competitors must give notice to the Secretary according to the directions given on an Entry Form to be obtained from him. All Entrance Fees to accompany Entry Forms.
5. No Competitor will be allowed to take more than one prize in the same class.
6. All specimens exhibited must have been grown by the Exhibitor in his own garden or allotment, or have been in his possession for two months previous to the Show. Any infringement of this Rule will disqualify the Competitor from obtaining a prize.
7. No Competitor will be allowed to remove specimens exhibited until 7 p.m.
8. The Committee will not be responsible for any damage which may happen to the exhibits or receptacles, but every care will be taken of the same.
9. All Exhibitors to bring plates or dishes where necessary for their exhibits. Plants must be shown in the pots in which they grew.
10. The Committee reserve the right to refuse an entry.
11. All exhibits for competition must be delivered to the Show ground free from expense to the Association, and to be staged not later than 10-30 a.m.
12. The awarding of the prizes will be left to the discretion of the Judges, and if not more than four entries are received in any one class, the First Prize may be withdrawn.
13. The exact number of specimens specified in the Schedule must be brought, otherwise the exhibit will be disqualified.
